• **AS A CENTRAL CITY**, Fredericton has much to offer. Biking through the city trails and the historic Garrison district is a popular experience. We suggest you make a stop and try a York County Strawberry Ciderita.

• **KINGS LANDING** is the closest you can get to time-traveling. This quaint village will show you what life was like 200 years ago. Witness living history as you explore the village and watch demonstrations of cooking, fabrication, and craftwork.

• **HARVEY** - this small town is home to the Big Fiddle, in 2 ways : an actual big fiddle, that you can get your picture with, and The Big Fiddle Still. Although, you can't tour the Big Fiddle Still, you can stop in at Black's Convenience to pick up their unique products.

• **ST. STEPHEN** is Canada's Chocolate town. Here you can tour the chocolate museum, and then visit Picaroons Five Kings Restaurant, to have some


delicious food and craft beer while you sit on the patio that overlooks the St. Croix River.

• **ST. ANDREWS** By the Sea is a town surrounded by ocean views. If whale watching is on your bucket list, there are a few options here to get you out on the water. You can also visit Kingsbrae Gardens, to see award-winning horticulture and indulge in fine cuisine at the Garden Café.

• **THE NEXT STOP** is New River Beach. This salt water beach is a provincial park with camping, a sandy beach, and picturesque hiking trails.

• **JUST DOWN THE ROAD** from New River Beach, you can find a hidden gem. Lepreau Falls is located just off the main road and offers a couple observation points for great photos.

• **TAKE ROUTE 7** return to Fredericton. While in the city, stop in to Grimross Brewery taproom to try their quality crafted brews.
